- 8 agreed to establish a new National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) as a departmental agency hosted by the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet from 1 October 2019, to replace the Ministry of Civil Defence and Emergency Management;
- 9 agreed that the core function of NEMA be to enable the Director, Civil Defence Emergency Management to meet their functions and duties and exercise their powers;
  - agreed that to fulfil its function, NEMA's role will be to work across central government and with local government, communities, iwi, and business to create an emergency management system that is ready and able to provide an effective and integrated response to, and recovery from, emergencies (as defined in the Civil Defence Emergency Management Act 2002);

- 11 **agreed** that to fulfil its function and role, NEMA will:
  - 11.1 provide a clear sense of direction of the emergency management sector;
  - 11.2 build the capability and capacity of the emergency management system to plan for, withstand, respond to, and recover from emergencies;
  - 11.3 lead or support responses to, and recovery from, emergencies (irrespective of cause);
  - 11.4 provide assurance to the government and the public about the performance and capability of the emergency management system to respond effectively;
- 12 **agreed** that in addition to these whole-of-system, all-hazard functions, NEMA will also have a leadership role across the 4Rs (risk reduction, readiness, response, and recovery) in relation to natural hazards, in particular geological hazards;
- 13 **noted** that the funding provided in Budget 2019 will enable the agency to be established and some priority functions to be strengthened;
- 14 **invited** the Minister of State Services and the Minister of Civil Defence to jointly report back to the Cabinet Government Administration and Expenditure Review Committee on the range of matters needed to establish the agency, including:
  - 14.1 inviting the Minister of State Services to issue drafting instructions to the Parliamentary Counsel Office for an Order in Council to establish a new Departmental Agency;
  - 14.2 the process for the State Services Commissioner to appoint an acting or substantive Chief Executive for the new agency;
  - 14.3 clarifying issues between the host agency and the departmental agency, including determining appropriate vote and appropriation structures, and employment arrangements;
  - 14.4 the government's response to the other recommendations related to the national leadership of New Zealand's emergency management system made by the Technical Advisory Group in its report *Better Responses to Natural Disasters and Other Emergencies*;

**noted** that as 2019/20 includes an establishment phase for this initiative, there is uncertain timing for some aspects of this work;

- agreed that any unspent funding for 2019/20 be transferred to 2020/21;
- **authorised** the Minister of Finance and the Appropriation Minister jointly to approve the final amount to be transferred following completion of the 2019/20 audited financial statements.
