Chapter 1: National Level Structures

Establish a National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) (Recs 1.0-1.5, 1.7, and 1.6.2)	Assessment as at 23 march 2018 The final functions and structure of a new agency will depend on the options analysis but work to date supports: • A greater level of proactive system leadership and the ability for the system leader to take an assertive and directive stance when required • Having a clear distinction between system leadership/oversight roles and Lead Agency roles (i.e. Natural Hazards). • The need for system-level oversight and coordination, supported by assurance and monitoring. • Retention of the 4R 'all hazards, all-risks' approach at the national level. • A greater level of and commitment to stewardship from across the system. Agree that there is a need to clarify who has responsibility for natural hazard risks because this role does not fit well with the proposed NEMA functions.	Funding Will need new money to support the preliminary work needed to set up NEMA (i.e. policy development, statutory requirements, and change management) and to fund the ongoing delivery of NEMA work. Project team will provide advice on options and likely level of investment.	Yes — the nature and scale of the legislative change will depend on the organisational form chosen and functions. A Departmental Agency can be set up through an Order In Council although the current CDEM Act may need amendments to support or reflect this.
